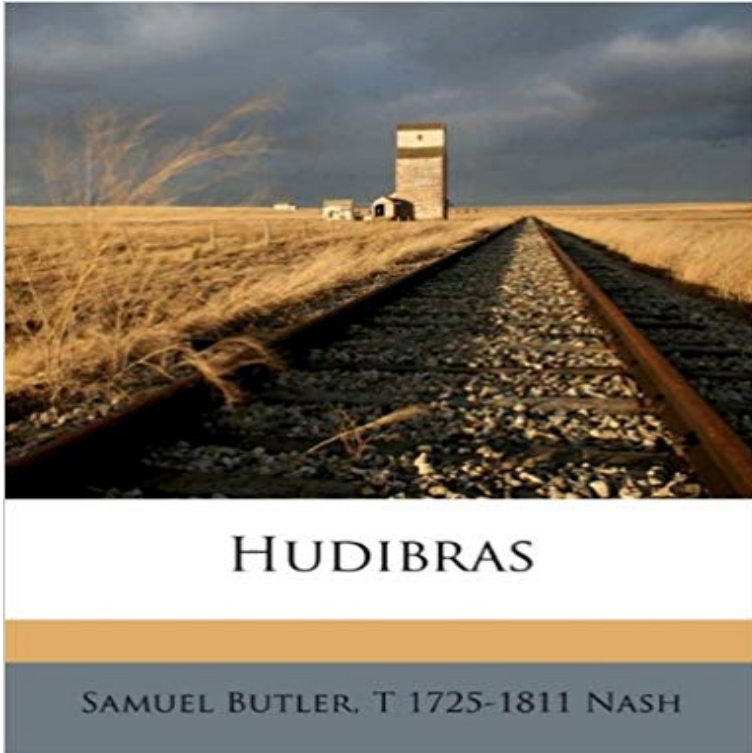


# Hudibras
